

# TROOP 99 GOALS

*Revised 2012*

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## **Participation**

- Earn the Quality Unit Award
- Earn the Camper Award (20+ nights)
- Each patrol earns the National Honor Patrol award
- 67% of Scouts on roster are active
  - 67% at troop meetings
  - 50% on troop outings
  - 50% on troop service hours

## **Advancement**

- No one in the troop for over sixteen months be below First Class. Interim goals are Tenderfoot within 3 months, Second Class within 7 months, and First Class within sixteen of joining
- Each First Class Scout will advance one rank per year
- Each Scout will earn 2 merit badges per year

## **Meetings**

- One and a half hour meetings 7:00 pm – 8:30 pm, Morris School
- Improved organization:
  - Scout led meetings
  - Themed months - skills organized by the ASM
  - One ASM guide per patrol
  - One PLC meeting per month
  - Quarterly Committee Meetings

## **Camping**

- Minimum of 20 nights/days of camping per year
- One patrol working with an ASM, take the lead in planning and publicizing each trip
- Practice camporee skills at meetings and on campouts

## **Hiking**

- Minimum of 20 miles of hiking/biking per year

## **Service**

- At least 20 troop-offered service hours per scout per year
- Annual Fish Lake service project & campout
- Commit to service hours for sponsors - VFW & Lion's Club

## **Patrols**

- Patrol method emphasized
- 5 to 10 boys per patrol
- Senior and Junior boys in each patrol
- No additional patrols until existing patrols reach 10 scouts each

## **Fundraising**

- Troop to be financially self-sustaining

## **Membership**

- 50% to earn Recruiter patch
- 75% growth by year end
- 85% retention

## **Training**

- All adult leaders meet basic training requirements
- At least one scout to JLT
- On-going troop-based Junior Leader Training for all scouts in leadership positions
- One leader at every Roundtable
